As you read, you will most likely come up with questions of your own. Jot them down and share them with us! Here are the questions our facilitators came up with as they read Chapters 15-18 last week. This being our last set of questions, I'd like to give a big shout out to our two amazing facilitators, Brad and Sam, for their insightful work!

Chapter 15: The Ultimate Price

- 1. Reflect on how America's push for innovation and technology over the years has invertedly impacted our ecosystems. (DDT, Race for Space). How has this impacted both humans and wildlife that live in the salt marsh? In your region? How do we balance science advancement and protection of the estuary?
- Revisit the encounter with Gibbons. He states that "these ghost traps can do endless harm to diamondback terrapins and other marsh wildlife." What impact have these traps had on salt marshes? What do you think can be done to help eliminate these traps?

Chapter 16: Living on the Edge

- 1. Toxaphene was the alternative for DDT, but still had a negative impact on humans and the environment. What regulations do you think should be in place before chemicals like these are considered for use in the environment?
- 2. What are your overall thoughts about superfund sites? What long term impacts do you see them having in the salt marsh or in your region?
- 3. The former Linden Chemical and Plastic (LCP) plant is one of the worst Superfund sites in the nation according to Seabrook. Do you think sending the toxins and waste to a landfill was the best solution? What are the lasting impacts of toxic waste production?
