### <u>Discussion Prompts</u> (Note that we plan to address these in breakout groups of your choice.)

"Waterfall" Icebreaker: What's on the menu? (In reference to the theme-based food and drink suggestions email from your moderators – see page 3)

## 1. What and where is the deep ocean?

What do you already know about it, and what are you curious to learn? During your breakout discussion, do a quick Google search to learn more, then share your findings with the group! You can also share something you learned on your TAS Cruise that deepened your understanding of the ocean.

### 2. In each of Casey's dives, something new is discovered.

What did you discover or learn from reading the Prologue and Chapters 1–3? Reflecting on ship life in olden times versus now, what's one thing you would have loved or feared about sailing in the past?

#### 3. Was there a particular sentence or section that stood out to you?

Did anything resonate with you or strike you as especially evocative? Why? You can also compare this to other books on the ocean you've read—how does this section's tone or perspective differ?

# 4. What past assumptions about the deep ocean were mentioned in this section of the book? Are there any assumptions we still hold, and what questions about the deep ocean remain unanswered?

## 5. Considering the discussion of the Carta Marina, how might you use maps as a teaching tool in your classroom?

Casey touches on politics, religion, geography, art, history, storytelling, and mythology while discussing this unique map. How could you incorporate these elements into your teaching? If maps aren't part of your lessons, what other classroom connections can you make from these themes?
