#### A) Chapter 4: The Scofflaw Fleet

Based on what you've learned so far about illegal fishing, imagine you're designing a computer program to detect suspicious vessels on the high seas. What variables, behaviors, or patterns would you program it to track? What might raise a red flag?

#### B) Chapter 5: Adelaide's Voyage

The quote "A rat in a maze is free to go anywhere, as long as it stays inside the maze" appears in this chapter. What do you think it means in the context of maritime law and freedom on the ocean?

## C) Chapter 6: Jail Without Bars

What does the author suggest about the romanticized notion of freedom at sea? How does this portrayal resonate—or not—with your own time on the water? What stood out to you in the contrast between that ideal and the harsh conditions described in the chapter?

## D) Chapter 7: Raiders of the Lost Arks

What different types of piracy are explored in this chapter? How do "corporate-style" piracy and illegal fishing operations differ from traditional notions of piracy?

### E) Chapter 8: The Middlemen

What are some of the hidden costs—or externalities—of globalization in the fishing industry? How does seafood labeling tie into this? When you hear seafood comes from a specific location, what do you think that really means about how it was caught, processed, and sold?
